Chris Lieber:

- The pre-bid meeting for Venezia will take place at 10:00am today
- FEMA flood repair projects will continue on trails, possible temporary closures on 400 locations of various lengths; no exact schedule, hope to be finished by end of April
- Ute Valley Master Plan will come before Parks Board for approval on Mar. 12
- Legacy Loop grant application due today—pedestrian underpasses, Fontanero trailhead/parking, other projects

Bill Koerner (TOSC):

- Manitou Springs City Council has voted to write a letter of support for portions of the Ring the Peak trail near their city reservoir.
- Q: Status of Creekside project in America the Beautiful Park? A: Soils management plan has been submitted to CDPHE; waiting for approval.
- Q: Status of south end of Legacy Loop? A: PR&CS continues to work on those connections.

Colin Shukie:

- Q: How much influence does the Committee have on completing trail gaps, particularly on the Cottonwood Trail? A: Chris explained that Parks is planning to make a pedestrian underpass in conjunction with Public Works repairs to drainage on Academy Blvd scheduled for 2017, and mentioned that Parks always looks for opportunities to partner when possible in order to use limited funds more efficiently.

Action Item

Chris Lieber presented an overview of the proposed land acquisition from the Union Pacific Railroad for the Rock Island Trail, including terms and timeline for the acquisition.

Motion: to approve the acquisition of approximately 7.022 acres from the Union Pacific Railroad for development of the Rock Island Trail and Legacy Loop
